As a principle of Hawaii Tropical Plants Incorporated, Daniel Kuhn has expanded his services to now include the mainland United States as a destination for tropical flora and fauna. In addition, Daniel Kuhn in 1985 and 1986 served the agricultural industry as the President of the Molokai Farm Bureau where he worked to establish a more reliable delivery system from the Molokai Irrigation System, was a driving force in legislation to urge an investigation of a more proficient management of the Molokai Irrigation System and was a prime mover of the publicly funded vacuum cooling plant facility for the farmers of Molokai.

With wife Chela and son Carlos, Daniel Kuhn continues to expand his interests in Hawaii and is a major economic employer of the island of Molokai providing jobs and expertise to an island whose contemporary history is steeped in the agricultural industry.
